We selected groupings of students carefully to work out the best combinations for effective learning and social interaction. Some of our classes are composite classes. The composite classes are a way of organising students to ensure we can keep as close as possible to the class sizes recommended by the Department of Education. Research shows it makes no difference to student learning whether they are in a composite class or single grade class. In all classes teachers teach to the level of their students rather than rigidly teaching the same content to the whole class. Some students will need extending others will need extra help to achieve curriculum outcomes. Regardless of the student grade teachers tailor the curriculum to the level of their students. Composite classes contribute to promoting student independence and developing self-assured learners. We often have questions about Kinder/Year 1 Composites. As the kindergarten students in the K-1 composite class have just commenced school generally we would select Kindergarten students who are showing they are independent and confident and ready to start learning curriculum content. Generally the Year 1 students will be students who can also work independently and are suited to the class.

You may have seen updates in the press about our building project. The project has been put out to tender and the tender closes on the 14.2.18. There is still some negotiation happening around aspects of the plan. A three level building will be built opposite Kindergarten but the building will sit in the slope with two levels at the top end of the playground and a third level at the bottom of the slope near the Arnett St library. Plans for that building are finalised but there is still some question around proposed changes to the admin block and repositioning of the toilets which will be demolished to make way for the new building. A suggestion has been made which I think will add some much needed additional facility to the school and solve some of the issues which have stalled finalising the project. Hopefully that will be finalised by the end of the month. When finished our new facilities will include 13 new classes, a new library and the current library refurbished into a classroom.

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Nut Allergies

As we have students with severe nut allergies we ask that you do not send products with nuts to school in lunch baxes. This includes peanut butter, nutella and bars with nut products.

Positive Rewards

When students are helpful safe, respectful learners they will accumulate awards which will help them achieve a bronze, silver or gold award.

Class teachers will give green certificates for behaviour each week. The certificate will be linked to the classroom reward system and all students should have the opportunity to receive the award if they have achieved individual or group behaviour goals.

When students have 10 green awards they will receive a bronze award, 20 green awards a silver award and 30 green awards a gold award. When students are awarded, bronze, silver and gold certificates their names will be placed in the appropriate prize draw boxes and students become eligible for a weekly prize draw.

In Term 4 a special reward event will be held for students who have been awarded gold awards. Students who are new to the school during the year can attend this if they have consistently achieved green awards since arrival.

We are changing the Principal's Award this year to recognise students who consistently follow the school rules "Helpful, Safe, Respectful Learner. Each assembly class teacher will nominate one student who will achieve the Principal's Award. Award winners will be acknowledged in assembly and the newsletter. At the end of term if these award winners have maintained consistently good behaviour they will be invited to a special Principal's Reward Activity. The reward activity is for those students who have been invited. We will still continue to operate our usual award system with the Principal's award focusing on excellence in behaviour.
