

From the Principal

It was great to see so many parents and carers at our Parent Information night this week. Please remember if you wish to discuss your child's progress or any issues with their teacher you can contact them at any time to do so. Teachers are not available to meet with parents whilst they are supervising students but they will be able to organize a suitable time to meet with you. Alternatively you can contact the office to organise a time to meet with the teacher.

Our school Learning Support Team meets regularly to discuss the progress of students, address any concerns about student learning and development and to plan school supports student learning and development needs.The team develops and implements a range of programs to support learning and development. We are currently formalising our reading intervention programs for 2018. Reading Interventions or support programs allow us to provide additional teaching supports so that all children develop a firm foundation for their reading. One of our significant programs in previous years has

been the Reading Recovery which provides program individualized reading lessons for targeted students in Year 1. The Department of Education is no longer running the Reading Recovery Program which means we can no longer run it within the school. We still have the staffing component in 2018 and are using this to transition to other support programs targeting needs across the school. We have purchased materials and trained Learning Support Staff in the Minilit and Rip it Up Reading programs. Both programs target phonic and other reading skills. We will target students needing support in Year 1 and 2 with the Minilit program and older students with Rip it Up Reading. In 2018 we will also continue provide to individualized reading intervention in Year 1 which targets reading texts and writing skills. These programs will complement existing programs in the school. Our EALD teachers provide specific support for students who speak English as a language additional supports for learning.

Our students enjoyed the recent swimming carnival held last week at Wentworthville Pool. The new



venue worked very well allowing us to run both novelties and races at the same time. We have a decreasing number of strong swimmers in the school and I would parents to follow urge swimming lessons for children. We live in a country where children will have easy access to swimmimg pools, beaches and rivers through out their lives. It is really important they learn to swim and develop those skills over a number of years so they can swim strongly.

Please do not send foods with nut products to school with your child as we have a number of children with severe allergies at school. Birthday cakes cannot be shared for this reason.






